DESCRIPTION

PowerPoint presentations are typically used to support oral presentations. However, this competition entry is to be a user-directed, stand-alone presentation. It can convey an academic concept, promotional information, or theological truth. The student is free to use any element that PowerPoint will support.

RULES

- -The design must have been created since the last EXCEL Convention.
- -While there are a number of graphic editing programs on the market, Adobe Photoshop is required for student convention competition (or any program supported by Adobe Photoshop).
- -The design must be submitted as a JPEG only. Image size must be no larger than 1250px-wide or 1250px-high at 4MB Max.

POSSIBLE PROJECT ARAS

These are not intended to limit the project possibilities, but are intended to stimulate creative thought about how to structure a project.

Promotional – Advertizing for an event or product.

Announcement - Announcement of wedding, engagement, etc.

Outreach - Tracts, flyers, cards, etc.

Logo – Church, youth group, or church program, etc.

Book Cover – Design a cover for a book.
