

(251) Scrapbook Page

PACKING: All contestants are responsible for the packaging, transporting and proper handling of their competition entries.

DELIVERY: All items must be brought to the Convention Wednesday morning and removed from the premises by Saturday morning.

DISPLAY: Entries must have a display card securely attached to the project with the following information neatly printed or typed: event, student's name, school name. Display card must be clearly visible.

WCA STUDENT CONVENTION IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR ENTRIES LOST, STOLEN, OR DAMAGED.

A scrapbook is defined as a book with blank pages for mounting and preserving pictures and memorabilia. The age-old craft of scrapbooking is recognized as a means for gathering, displaying and passing on personal, family and historical information along with photographs and both tangible and intangible bits of memories. Meaningfulness is emphasized. Photo safety and long-term preservation is expected to be taken into consideration.

Ideas for scrapbook pages:

1. Celebration of an event (birthday, holiday, wedding, graduation, etc.)
2. General (vacation, pets, day to day home and family, nature, church or youth events, etc.)

RULES

1. Must be an 8 ½ "x11" or 12"x12" single or double page made within the preceding year and not entered in competition previously. A double page layout is considered one page.
2. A page protector specifically designed for the size and type of scrapbook page being submitted must cover each entry. Cannot be enclosed in a book.
3. Plastic template pages are allowed such as Project Life, SNAP, etc.
4. A digital scrapped page is allowed.
5. Pictures and memorabilia must be attached to and submitted on an actual scrapbook page.
6. The entry must be the workmanship of the student.
7. Techniques and tools such as stamped designs, decorative punches, stickers, doodling, metal and floral embellishments are allowed, but not to be the main focus and overpower the photos and journaling.

Checklist:

1. Scrapbook page(s) in a protector
2. Submit a report.
